

The Science

RELIEF FROM DEPRESSION

"Helpers' High" A neurochemical response which is similar to anti-depressants, has been shown to relieve depression and may even be evolution's way of training humans to be ethical!
(Wilson. Psychology of Philanthropy. 2015)

FIGHTING LONELINESS

Giving is considered a "pro-social behavior" which improves mood and boosts overall well-being. Two studies found that giving reduces loneliness and has many several other benefits! (Lanser. Emotion. 2022)

INCREASED POSITIVITY

Two studies found that when participants gave money to others it increased their happiness MORE than spending money on themselves. (Suittie. Greater Good. 2010)

IMPROVED IMMUNE RESPONSE

Multiple studies are forming a body of literature that support the idea that giving strengthens the immune system. (Yörük. Journal of Economic Pscyhology.2014)

LOWER BLOOD PRESSURE


Three studies found that in older adults diagnosed with high blood pressure that the more they gave to others the lower their blood pressure was even up to two years later!
(Whillans. Health Psychology. 2020)

LOWERED STRESS

One study found that giving reduced stress, not just for the giver and the receiver, but even for someone who merely witnessed the kindness (Fryburg. American Journal of Lifestyle Medicine. 2021)

INCREASED LIFESPAN & GENETIC HEALTH

One study found that pro social behaviors like giving can positively impact leukocyte gene expression profiles in ways that contribute to many health advantages! (Nelson-Coffey. Psychoneuroendocrinology. 2017)







College Guild was recently honored to receive a generous grant from The Kathryn B. McQuade Foundation to help reach segment of the incarcerated population that grew over 525% between 1990 and 2021: Women. Thanks to this grant and your generous support we have been able to increase the number of women we serve by almost 70% from 2019 to 2023. But that's not enough.

Despite being more likely than their male counterparts to enter incarceration with a high school diploma, women are less likely to complete educational coursework and receive credentials of any kind.


Why, when education is so critical to thriving after release are women being left behind?

The educational barriers facing disadvantaged women, inside and out, are unique and thus the structure of an educational program designed to help them overcome those barriers must be made with women in mind.

College Guild is proud to be creating a new course specifically for America's most forgotten segment of the population. We will bring our social and emotional learning methods into women's prisons and play a vital role in giving hope and a connection to a community beyond the prison walls.

Together, we can reach these women, and give them a chance to reach us as well. College Guild needs to raise \$7400 to finish our first woman-centric course. Will you join us in the fight to reach America's forgotten women?




